## INTRODUCTION


The Paul Rusch Memorial Center succeeds to a moving ideal and practice of Dr. Paul Rusch who had revived democratically impoverished farming villages after World War II. And it was built as the base where it widely introduces idea of Dr. Rusch's "Service to others" to Japan and the world of the 21st century.



It was young people in Yatsugatake local that proposed this construction plan who yearned for Dr. Rusch's achievements. "It is our mission that succeeds to his ideal." A lot of citizens of Japan and the U.S. agreed to young people's wills, and the charity donations were started. Also Japanese American Football Association participated in this movement, and the circle of sympathy had been extended greatly.

The Paul Rusch Memorial Center and The Japanese American Football Hall of Fame was assumed the proof of Japan and the U.S. citizens' friendship and completed on March 28, 1996. The people who visit the center are to be surely discovered "Power of the dream and hope" that doesn't wink out even if the time changes.
